The third part (20d-22)

+ ALL the eyes, in the synagogue, were fixed on him;
= ²¹ and he began *TO SAY* to them:

“TODAY IS FULFILLED THIS SCRIPTURE IN YOUR EARS.”

+ ²² And ALL bore testimony to him
+ and wondered at the words of grace coming out of his mouth
= and they *SAID*:

«IS NOT THIS THE SON OF JOSEPH?»

The fourth part (23-27)

* ²³ And he *SAID* to them: «Surely, you *WILL SAY* to me this parable:

: “Physician,
+ heal

YOURSELF!”

: All what we have heard being done
+ do here also,

**AT CAPERNAUM,
IN YOUR HOMETOWN.»**

* ²⁴ He *SAID*: “Truly I *SAY* to you:
“NO PROPHET IS ACCEPTED

IN HIS HOMETOWN.”

* ²⁵ In truth I *SAY* to you:

+ **THERE WERE MANY** **WIDOWS** in the days of Elijah **IN ISRAEL**
when the sky was closed for three years and six months
as there came a great famine over all the land;

:: ²⁶ and to **NONE OF THEM** was sent **ELIJAH**,
– if not only **TO ZAREPHATH OF SIDON** to a woman who was a **WIDOW**.

+ ²⁷ **THERE WERE MANY** **lepers** **IN ISRAEL** in the times of **ELISHA** the prophet
:: and **NONE OF THEM** **was cleansed**,
– if not only **NAAMAN THE SYRIAN.»**

The conclusion (28-30)

+ ²⁸ And all were filled with fury in the *synagogue*, by hearing this.

. ²⁹ And **having risen up**,
 = they drove him out of the *town*;
 = and led him till to the brow of the hill
 = on which was built their *town*,
to **throw him down**.

+ ³⁰ But he, passing through the *midst of them*, went away.

The passage as a whole (4:14-30)

¹⁴ Jesus returned, in the power of the Spirit, to Galilee and a report spread throughout all the surrounding region about him. ¹⁵ And he **WAS TEACHING IN THEIR SYNAGOGUES, PRAISED** by ALL. ¹⁶ And he came to Nazara where he had grown up and he entered, according to his custom on the Sabbath day, in the synagogue.

He got up to read ¹⁷ and to him was given the book of the **prophet ISAIAH**. Having unrolled the book, he found the place where it was written:

¹⁸ «The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to announce the good news to the poor; he has sent me to proclaim to the captives liberty

AND TO THE BLIND THE RECOVERY OF SIGHT,

to set the oppressed at liberty, ¹⁹ to proclaim a year in which the Lord favors.»

²⁰ And having rolled the book up, and given it back to the servant, he sat down.

ALL the eyes **IN THE SYNAGOGUE** were fixed on him

²¹ and he began to say to them:

«**TODAY IS FULFILLED THIS SCRIPTURE IN YOUR EARS.**»

²² And **ALL BORE TESTIMONY** to him and **WONDERED AT** the **WORDS** of grace coming out of his mouth and they said:

«**IS NOT THIS THE SON OF JOSEPH?**»

²³ And he said to them: «By all means, you will say to me this parable: “Physician, heal yourself!” All what we have heard being done at Capernaum, do here also, in your homeland.» ²⁴ He said: «Truly, I say to you:

“NO PROPHET IS ACCEPTED IN HIS HOMELAND.”

²⁵ In truth, I say to you: there were many widows in Israel in the days of **ELIJAH** when the sky was closed for three years and six months, as there came a great famine all over the land: ²⁶ and to none of them was sent **ELIJAH** but only into Zarephath of Sidon to a woman who was a widow. ²⁷ And there were many lepers in Israel in the times of **ELISHA the prophet**; and none of them was cleansed but only Naaman the Syrian.»

²⁸ They were **ALL** filled with **FURY IN THE SYNAGOGUE WHEN THEY HEARD** that. ²⁹ Rising up, they drove him out of the town and led him to the brow of the mountain on which their town was built to throw him down. ³⁰ But he, passing through the midst of them, went away.

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Jesus' day at Capernaum

Sequence B2: Luke 4: 31-44

JESUS	PUTS AN END	TO THE REIGN OF THE DEVIL	31-37
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Jesus heals Simon's mother-in-law	38-39
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JESUS	BRINGS	THE REIGN OF GOD	40-44
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1. JESUS PUTS AN END THE REIGN OF THE DEVIL (4,31-37)

.³¹ He went down *to Capernaum, a town of Galilee,*
. and he **was teaching** them on the days of sabbath.
–³² And they were **astonished** at his **teaching**
– because with **POWER** was his **WORD**.

+³³ In the synagogue there was a man
+ having the spirit of an unclean **demon**.

= *he cried out in a loud voice:*
. ³⁴ «Ah! What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth?
. Have you come to destroy us?

I know who you are: THE HOLY ONE OF GOD.»

= ³⁵ *Jesus rebuked him, saying:*
. «Be silent!
. And come out of him.»

+ The **demon** having thrown him in the midst,
+ came out of him,
+ having done him no harm.

.³⁶ **Astonishment** CAME upon **ALL** and they are talking with *one another*, saying:
– «What kind of **WORD** is this
: for with **POWER** and might he commands the unclean spirits
: and they come out?»
. ³⁷ And a report **WENT OUT** about him *into ALL places of the surrounding region*.

2. JESUS HEALS SIMON'S MOTHER-IN-LAW (4:38-39)

+³⁸ **HAVING RISEN UP** from the synagogue,
+ he entered in the house of Simon.

: Mother-in-law of Simon was held fast by a great **FEVER**
– and they besought him for *her*.
:
:³⁹ Having stood over her, he rebuked the **FEVER**
– and it left *her*.

+ Immediately **HAVING RISEN UP**,
+ she served them.

3. JESUS BRINGS THE REIGN OF GOD (4,40-44)

• ⁴⁰ **WHEN THE SUN WAS SETTING,**
:: *all* those who have any **SICK** with various diseases
– *brought* them to him
:: and he, laying his hands upon **every one** of them,
– *healed* them.

= ⁴¹ Came out also **DEMONS** of *many* crying out and **SAYING:**
- “You are the **SON OF GOD.**”
= But he, rebuking them, did not allow them **TO SPEAK**
- for they knew that he was the **CHRIST.**

• ⁴² **WHEN THE DAY WAS COMING,**
:: having left, he **went** into a deserted place.
– **The crowds** were seeking after him
and they came unto him
– and they hold him back
:: lest he would **go** away from them.

⁴³ But he said to them:
· “**To other towns also** I must **EVANGELIZE** the **KINGDOM OF GOD**
: because for this I have been sent”.
· ⁴⁴ And he was **PROCLAIMING** *in the synagogues of Judea.*

4. JESUS' DAY AT CAPERNAUM (4,31-44)

³¹ He went down to Capernaum, *a town of GALILEE* and he **WAS TEACHING** them on the days of sabbath.

³² And they were astonished at his **TEACHING** because his word was with power.

³³ In the synagogue, there was a man having the spirit of an unclean **DEMON**. he **CRIED OUT** in a loud voice:

³⁴ “Ah! What have you to do with us, **JESUS OF NAZARETH?**
Have you come to destroy us?
I KNOW *who you are:* **THE HOLY ONE OF GOD.”**

³⁵ Jesus **REBUKED** him, saying: “**BE SILENT** and **COME** out of him!”
The demon, having thrown him in the midst, **CAME** out of him, having done him no harm.

³⁶ Astonishment came upon **ALL** and they are talking with **ONE ANOTHER**, saying: “What kind of the word is this, for with power and might he commands the **unclean spirits** and they **COME OUT?**” ³⁷ And **WENT OUT** a report about him to **ALL** places of the surrounding region.

³⁸ Having risen up from the synagogue, he entered in the house of Simon. Simon's mother-in-law was held fast by a great **fever** and they besought him for her. ³⁹ Stood over her, he **REBUKED** the **fever** and it **WENT OUT** from her. Immediately having gotten up, she served them.

⁴⁰ At sunset, **ALL** those who have **any sick with various diseases** brought them to him and he, laying his hands upon **EVERY ONE OF THEM**, **HEALED** them.

⁴¹ **CAME OUT** also **DEMONS** of many **CRYING OUT** and saying that “You are **THE SON OF GOD.”**
But he, **REBUKING** them, **DID NOT ALLOW THEM TO SPEAK**, for **THEY KNEW** that **he was** **THE CHRIST.**

⁴² At daybreak, having **COME OUT**, he **WENT** into a deserted place. The crowds were seeking after him and they came unto him and they hold him back lest he would **GO** away from them.

⁴³ But he said to them: “To other **towns** also I must **ANNOUNCE THE GOOD NEWS** of **THE KINGDOM OF GOD;** because for this I have been sent.”

⁴⁴ And he was **PROCLAIMING** in the synagogues of **JUDEA.**

Conclusion: the crowds are listening and healed by Jesus 15-16

1. INTRODUCTION: JESUS TEACHES THE CROWDS (5,1-3)

+ ¹ It happened that	while the <i>CROWD</i>	was pressing	on him
+ and	HEARING	the Word	of God,
- and he	was	standing	
- <i>by</i> the lake	of GENNESARET		
. ² and he saw	<i>two boats</i>		
. standing	<i>by</i> the lake.		

	<i>The fishermen</i>	having gotten out	
	were washing	<i>their nets.</i>	

. ³ Having gotten	into <i>one of the boats</i>		
. which was	of SIMON ,		
- he asked	him		
- <i>from</i> the land	to put out	a little;	
+ now having sat down,			
+ from the boat	he was TEACHING	the <i>CROWDS</i> .	

2. THE MIRACULOUS DRAUGHT OF FISH AND THE CONFESSION OF SIMON PETER
(5,4-11)

+ ⁴ <i>After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon:</i>		
· «Put out	into	the deep-water
· AND LET DOWN YOUR NETS	FOR	A CATCH. »

+ ⁵ <i>Answering, Simon said to him:</i>		
:: «Master, WHOLE night	we have worked hard	
:: and NOTHING	we have taken,	
= but at your word	I will let down	the nets. »

- ⁶ Having done this,		
- they enclosed	a great	number of fishes ,
= so that were about	to tear	their nets.
.. ⁷ They signaled	to their partners	in the other boat,
.. to come	TO TAKE	them.
- They came	and they filled	both boats,
= so that about to sink	they were.	

⁸ *Having seen Simon Peter
fell down at the knees of Jesus
saying:*

«Go away from me, for I am a sinful man, O Lord!»

- ⁹ For astonishment	had seized	<i>him</i>
- <i>and all</i>	<i>those who were</i>	<i>with him,</i>
.. because of the catch	of fishes	
.. which they	HAD TAKEN.	
- ¹⁰ And likewise	<i>James and John,</i>	<i>sons of Zebedee,</i>
- who were	partners of	<i>Simon.</i>

+ <i>Jesus said to Simon:</i>		
· «Do not be afraid,		
· FROM NOW ON	MEN	YOU WILL BE CATCHING. »

+ ¹¹ <i>When they had brought the boats to land,</i>		
:: having left	ALL,	
= they followed	him.	

3. THE CONFESSION OF A LEPER AND HIS PURIFICATION (5,12-14)

+ ¹² It happened that	while he	was in one	of the towns,
+ and behold,	a man	full	of leprosy
	. <i>seeing</i>	<i>Jesus,</i>	
	. <i>falling down</i>	<i>on his face,</i>	
	. <i>he besought him saying:</i>		
		:: «Lord,	if you WISH,
		= you can	PURIFY me.»

	. ¹³ <i>And stretching out the hand,</i>		
	. <i>he touched him saying:</i>		
		::	«I WISH,
		= be	PURIFIED. »
+ And immediately	the leprosy	departed	from him.

- ¹⁴ And HE, himself	COMMANDED him
- not to TELL	<i>to anybody,</i>
	: but «Having gone,
	. show yourself to the priest
	. and offer for the PURIFICATION of you,
- just as	HAS ORDERED MOSES
- for a TESTIMONY	<i>to them.</i> »

4. CONCLUSION: THE CROWDS LISTEN TO AND ARE HEALED BY JESUS (5,15-16)

+ ¹⁵ Now	<i>was spreading</i>	all the more	the WORD about HIM.
	And were gathering to him	crowds	numerous
	TO HEAR	and to be healed	of their sickness.
+ ¹⁶ Now HE	<i>was withdrawing himself</i>	into the deserts	and PRAYING.

5. THE CALL OF SIMON PETER (5,1-16)

COMPOSITION OF THE SEQUENCE

¹ It happened that while the **CROWD** was pressing upon him and **HEARING** the **WORD** of God, he was there standing by the lake of Gennesaret ² and he saw two boats standing by the lake.

THE FISHERMEN, HAVING GOTTEN OUT, WERE WASHING THEIR NETS.

³ After getting into one of the boats which was of Simon, he asked him to put out a little from the land and having sat down, from the boat he was **TEACHING** the **CROWDS**.

⁴ When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon:

- * **«PUT OUT** into the deep-water
- * and **CAST** your nets for a catch.»

⁵ Answering Simon said to him: «Master, we have worked hard all the night and we have taken nothing, but at your word I will cast the nets.» ⁶ Having done this, they enclosed a **FULL** of many fishes so that their nets were about to tear. ⁷ They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to take them. They came and they **FILLED** both boats so that they were about to sink.

- ⁸ **HAVING SEEN (this), Simon Peter FELL DOWN at the knees of Jesus SAYING:**
: **«Go away from me, for I am a SINFUL man,**
– **LORD.»**

⁹ For astonishment had seized him and all those who were with him, because of the catch of fishes which they had taken.

= ¹⁰ *And likewise James and John, sons of Zebedee, WHO WERE PARTNERS OF SIMON.*

Jesus
said to
Simon:

«DO NOT BE AFRAID, FROM NOW ON YOU WILL BE CATCHING MEN.»

= ¹¹ *When they had brought the boats to land, having left all, THEY FOLLOWED HIM.*

¹² It happened that while he was in one of the towns, and behold, a **man FULL** of leprosy

- **SEEING Jesus, FALLING DOWN on his face, he besought him SAYING:**
– **«LORD,**
: **if you wish, you can PURIFY me.»**

¹³ Stretching out the hand, he touched him saying: «I wish, be purified.» And immediately the leprosy left him. ¹⁴ And he himself, commanded him to tell no one, but: «Having gone,

- * **SHOW** yourself to the priest
- * and **OFFER** for your purification just as Moses had ordered for a testimony to them.»

¹⁵ And the **WORD** about him was spreading all the more and great **CROWDS** were gathering to him to **HEAR** and to **BE HEALED** of their sickness.

¹⁶ And he was withdrawing himself into the deserts and praying.

1. JESUS HEALS A MAN WITH PARALYZED LEGS (5,17-26)

+ ¹⁷ It happened that, in one of those days, when he was **TEACHING**
 : and were **SITTING** some of the Pharisees and of the **TEACHERS-of-the-Law**
 : who were coming from all the villages of Galilee and of Judea and of Jerusalem
 + and the power of the **LORD** was with him that he may **HEAL**.

· ¹⁸ Behold, men were bringing on a couch **A MAN**
 · who was paralyzed;
 – and they sought to bring him in and to lay him **BEFORE HIM**.

 · ¹⁹ *Not finding any way to bring him in* because of the crowd,
 – having gone up on the roof,
 – through the tiles they let him down with the couch into the midst **BEFORE JESUS**.

 • ²⁰ Seeing their **faith**, he **said**:
 • «**MAN**, **IS FORGIVEN FOR YOU THE SINS OF YOU**.»

²¹ They began to **REASON**, the Scribes and the Pharisees **SAYING**:
 : «**WHO** is this who *speaks* blasphemies?
 : **WHO** can **FORGIVE SINS**
 - if not **God** alone?»

²² Jesus, having known their **REASONINGS**, answering **SAID**:
 : «**WHY** are you reasoning in your hearts?
 : ²³ **WHICH** is easier, *to say* **“YOUR SINS ARE FORGIVEN”**
 - or *to say* **“RISE UP and walk”**?»

• ²⁴ But that you may **know**
 • that **THE SON OF MAN** has power on earth to **FORGIVE SINS**,»
 · he **said** to the paralytic: «I **say** to you, **WAKE UP**,
 – take your couch and go home.»

 · ²⁵ Immediately, **HAVING RISEN** before them,
 – taking up that on which he was **LAI**D, he went home,
 – **GLORIFYING God**.

 · ²⁶ **Amazement** seized them all and they were **GLORIFYING God**
 · and they were filled with **fear**, *saying*: «We have seen **strange things** today.»

2. JESUS, THE PHYSICIAN AND THE BRIDEGROOM (5,27-35)

–²⁷ And after this, he went out
 . and saw a TAX-COLLECTOR named Levi **SITTING** at the TAX-OFFICE.
 . and he said to him: «Follow me!»
 +²⁸ And having left all, **RISING UP**, he followed him.
 –²⁹ And Levi made a great feast for him in his house
 . and there was a numerous crowd of TAX-COLLECTORS
 . and others who were with them **SITTING AT MEAL.**

+ ³⁰	The Pharisees and their scribes	were murmuring	against his disciples	saying:
:	«Why with	THE TAX COLLECTORS AND SINNERS	do you eat and drink?»	

= ³¹	Answering,	Jesus said to them:		
.	«Have no need	those who are well	of PHYSICIAN ,	
	– but	THOSE WHO ARE SICK.		
.	³² I have not come	to call	the righteous,	
	– but	THE SINNERS	into conversion.»	

+ ³³	But	they	said	to him:
:	«[Why do]	the disciples of John	FAST often and make prayers	
	and likewise	those of the Pharisees		
:	and	THOSE OF YOU	eat and drink?»	

= ³⁴		Jesus said to them:		
.	«Can you	MAKE THE SONS OF THE BRIDE-CHAMBER,	FASTING	
	– while	THE BRIDEGROOM is	with them?	
.	³⁵ Will come	the days,		
	– in which	THE BRIDEGROOM is taken	from them;	
			then THEY WILL FAST in those days.»	

3. THE PARABLE OF THE OLD AND OF THE NEW (5,36-39)

³⁶ *He said also a parable to them:*

+ « NO ONE	having torn	a patch	from a	NEW	garment
+	puts	it	upon an	OLD	garment.
	: <i>otherwise</i>	he will tear	also the	NEW	
	– and	with the		OLD	it will not match
	– the patch	of the		NEW.	

+ ³⁷ And NO ONE	puts	NEW	wine		
+	into	OLD	<i>wineskins</i>		
	: <i>otherwise</i>	the NEW	wine	will burst	the <i>wineskins</i>
	– and	(the wine) itself		will be poured out	
	– and	the	<i>wineskins</i>	will be destroyed.	

	³⁸ Rather,	NEW	wine		
	into	NEW	<i>wineskins</i>	must be put!	

– ³⁹ NO ONE	having drunk	of the OLD			
	desires of	the NEW.			
– For he said:					
–		“the OLD		is better!”»	

4. JESUS, KING AND LORD OF THE SABBATH (6,1-5)

+ ¹ And it happened that on a *sabbath*
while **HE** was passing through the grain-fields

+ and *HIS DISCIPLES* were picking and *EATING* some heads of grain,
rubbing them in their hands.

² *Some Pharisees said:*

= «Why are you **DOING** what is **NOT ALLOWED** on the *sabbath*?»

³ *Answering them, Jesus said:*

. «Have you not read as this
. what **DAVID DID**
. when he *WAS HUNGRY* he and *THOSE WHO WERE WITH HIM,*
- ⁴ how he entered in the house of God,
. and, having taken the bread of offering,
. he *ATE* and gave it to *THOSE WHO WERE WITH HIM,*
. what is **NOT ALLOWED** to eat if not only for the **PRIESTS**?»

⁵ *And he said to them:*

= «**THE SON OF MAN** is **LORD** of the *sabbath*.»

5. JESUS HEALS A MAN WITH A PARALYZED RIGHT HAND (6,6-11)

- + ⁶ It happened that on another sabbath he entered in the synagogue
- and he was **TEACHING**
- + and there was a man there
- and his right hand was **WITHERED**.

+ ⁷ The scribes and the Pharisees	WERE WATCHING HIM CLOSELY (to see)
• If he would HEAL	on the sabbath
• so that they might find	something TO ACCUSE him.

= ⁸ But he knew their thoughts	and he said to the man who had the withered hand:
: « <i>Wake up</i>	and stand forth in the midst.»
: <i>Having risen,</i>	he stood up.

⁹ Jesus said to them:	
«I ASK you	
• WHETHER is allowed on the sabbath	TO DO GOOD or TO DO EVIL,
•	TO SAVE LIFE or TO LOSE IT?»

= ¹⁰ Looking around at them all,	he said to him:
: « <i>Stretch out</i>	your hand.»
: He did so	and his hand <i>was restored</i> .

+ ¹¹ But they were filled with fury,	
+ and THEY WERE DISCUSSING among them	
• WHAT	THEY MIGHT DO to Jesus.

6. MASTERS OF THE LAW AND THE BRIDEGROOM OF THE NEW COVENANT

(5,17–6,11)

¹⁷ It happened that, in one of those days, when he was **TEACHING** and (there) were sitting some of the **Pharisees and the teachers of the Law** who were coming from all the villages of Galilee and of Judea and of Jerusalem, and there was the power of the Lord that he may **HEAL**. ¹⁸ And behold some persons bringing on a couch **A** paralyzed **MAN** were seeking to bring him in and to lay him before Him. ¹⁹ Not finding any way to bring him in because of the crowd, having gone up on the roof, through the tiles they let him down with the couch into the midst before Jesus. ²⁰ Seeing their faith, he said: «**MAN**, your **sins** are forgiven for you.» ²¹ **The scribes and the Pharisees** began to reason, saying: «Who is this who speaks blasphemies? Who **can** forgive sins if not God alone?» ²² **KNOWING THEIR REASONINGS**, in answering, Jesus said: «Why are you reasoning in your hearts? ²³ Which is easier, to say “Your sins are forgiven”, or to say “**RISE UP** and walk”? ²⁴ For that you may know that **THE SON OF MAN** has **power** on earth to forgive sins», he said to the paralytic: «I say to you, wake up, take your couch and go home.» ²⁵ Immediately, **HAVING RISEN** before them, taking up that on which he was laid, he went home, glorifying God. ²⁶ Amazement seized them all and they were glorifying God and they were filled with **fear**, saying: «We have seen strange things today.»

²⁷ After this, he went out and saw a tax-collector named Levi sitting at the tax office and he said to him: “Follow me!” ²⁸ Having left all, **RIISING UP**, he followed him. ²⁹ And Levi made for him a great feast in his house and there was a large crowd of tax collectors and others who were sitting at meal with them. ³⁰ And **the Pharisees and their scribes** were murmuring, saying to the **DISCIPLES**: «Why do **YOU EAT** and drink with the tax-collectors and the **sinners**?» ³¹ Answering, Jesus said to them: «Those who are well have no need of the physician, but those who are sick. ³² I have not come to call the righteous but the sinners into conversion.» ³³ They said to him: «Why do the disciples of John and those of the Pharisees fast often and make prayers, but those of you **EAT** and drink?» ³⁴ Jesus said to them: «Can you make to fast the friends of the spouse while the bridegroom is with them? ³⁵ The days will come when the bridegroom will be taken from them, then they will fast in those days.»

JOHN, having called to himself two of his disciples, ¹⁹ sent them to the Lord saying: «Are you THE ONE WHO IS TO COME or shall we wait for another?» ²⁰ Came near to him, the men said: «JOHN THE BAPTIST has sent us to you to say to you: “Are you THE ONE WHO IS TO COME or shall we wait for another?”» ²¹ In that hour, he healed many of diseases, of infirmities and of evil spirits and to many who were blind he granted grace to see. ²² Answering, he said to them: «Go to announce to JOHN what you have seen and heard: the blind men see, the lame WALK, the lepers are cleansed and the deaf persons hear; the dead are raised and to the poor the good news is announced.

²³ AND BLESSED IS THE ONE WHO HAS NOT STUMBLED BECAUSE OF ME!»

²⁴ When the messengers of JOHN went away, he began to say to the crowd concerning JOHN: «What did you go to contemplate in the desert? A reed shaken by the wind? ²⁵ But what did you go out to see? A man clothed in fine garments? Behold: those who dress in sumptuous garments and live in luxury are in the royal palaces. ²⁶ But what did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes I say to you, even more than a prophet! ²⁷ This is the one about whom it is written: “Behold I send my messenger ahead of you, who shall prepare your way in front of you.” ²⁸ I say to you: there is none greater than JOHN among those born of women, but the least in the kingdom of God is greater than him.

²⁹ All the people having heard, and even the tax collectors, have justified God, having been baptized with the baptism of JOHN. ³⁰ But the PHARISEES and the lawyers have rejected the plan of God for them, not having been baptized by him.

³¹ To what then shall I compare the men of this generation and to what are they alike? ³² They are like children sitting in the market place and calling to one another, saying:

“FOR YOU WE HAVE PLAYED FLUTE AND YOU DID NOT DANCE,
FOR YOU WE HAVE SUNG A LAMENT AND YOU DID NOT WEEP.”

³³ For JOHN THE BAPTIST HAS COME neither eating bread nor drinking wine and YOU said: ‘he has a demon!’ ³⁴ And the Son of man HAS COME eating and drinking and YOU said: ‘Look, that man, a glutton and a drunkard, friend of the tax collectors and the sinners!’ ³⁵ But the Wisdom is justified by all her children.»

³⁶ A PHARISEE asked him to eat with him; being ENTERED into the house of the PHARISEE, he reclined at table. ³⁷ And behold a woman who was sinner in the city, having known that he was at table in the house of the PHARISEE, brought an alabaster vase of perfume ³⁸ and, stood behind him at his feet, WEEPING, she began to wet his feet with her tears and she wiped them with the hair of her head and she kissed his feet and she anointed them with perfume. ³⁹ The PHARISEE who had invited him, having seen this, said to himself: «This man, if he were a prophet, he would know of what sort is this woman who is touching him, that she is a sinner!» ⁴⁰ Answering, Jesus said to him: «Simon, I have something to say to you.» — «Master, say on,» he said. ⁴¹ «A creditor had two debtors. The one owed five hundred denarii, the other fifty. ⁴² When they had nothing to pay back, he forgave them both. Which of them then will love him more?»

⁴³ Answering, Simon said: «I suppose, the one whom he forgave the more.» He said to him:

«YOU HAVE JUDGED RIGHTLY!»

⁴⁴ And having turned unto the woman, he said to Simon: «Do you see this woman? - ⁶ Another fell upon the rock and, having grown up, it withered for it had no moisture.

- ⁸ Another fell into a good soil and, having grown up, it produced fruit a hundredfold.»

Saying this, he called out: «Whoever has ears to hear, let him hear!» ⁹ His disciples were interrogating him about what might be the parable. ¹⁰ He said: «To you IT HAS BEEN GIVEN to KNOW the mysteries of the KINGDOM OF GOD, but to others it is in parables so that seeing they may not see and hearing they may not understand.

⁴⁶ Jesus said: «Someone has touched me, for *I have known* that a power has gone out from me!»

⁴⁷ The woman having seen that she could not remain unnoticed, **trembling** came forward and, **FELL** before him, she announced before *ALL THE PEOPLE* for what reason she had touched him and how she had been **HEALED** immediately. ⁴⁸ He said to her: «**Daughter**, your **FAITH** has **SAVED** you! Go in peace.»

⁴⁹ When he was still speaking someone came from the house of the **chief of the synagogue** saying: «Your **daughter** is **DEAD**, do not disturb the Master anymore.» ⁵⁰ Jesus having heard answered him: «Do not be afraid, have **FAITH** only and she shall be **SAVED**.» ⁵¹ Having come to the **HOUSE**, he let **NO ONE TO ENTER** with him, except Peter, John and James, also the father and the mother of the child.

⁴⁶ Now reasoning arose among them: Who was the greatest among them? ⁴⁷ Jesus, knowing the reasoning of their heart, *taken A SMALL CHILD*, he made him stand beside him ⁴⁸ and said to them: «Whoever receives this small child in my name, it is me that he receives, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me. For the least among all of you, that one is the greatest.» ⁴⁹ Answering, John said to him: «Master, we have seen someone casting out demons in your name and we have forbidden him because **HE DOES NOT FOLLOW WITH US**.»
